Here is some of the latest news and information from Scoil Mhuire:

Active Schools Update

1- Run Around Europe Challenge

Scoil Mhuire is currently working towards an Active Flag. As part of this, we are partaking in the 'Run Around Europe Challenge' (https://activeschoolflag.ie/run-around-europe-challenge/). This is a fourweek challenge and as a result the children may wear their tracksuit every day until the Easter break if they wish.

2 – Active Playgrounds

Another aspect of the Active Flag work will be the development of 'Active Playgrounds' – a structured pupil-led approach to play at break times. The Active Schools Committee and the Student Council have already started work in developing new ideas and games for lunch time. We will be sending out more information in a separate email in the coming weeks. We are also asking children **not** to bring in footballs (of any size) from home to play with at lunch time.

World Book Day 2024

World Book Day will take place on Thursday March 7th this year. We have decided that we will give the dressing up aspect a skip this year and move to a rota of every second year for this activity. Classes will engage in lots of other fun activities to celebrate World Book Day and the traditional €1.50 book tokens will also be given out.

Cost of Bus Hire

The costs involved with hiring buses have escalated in recent years and was discussed by the Board of Management recently. We have traditionally charged €5 for 'regular' bus trips (GAA matches, events in Cork etc.), however, we will now have to charge €7.50 per trip to avoid losses where necessary. The use of private cars for lifts is discouraged by school insurer Allianz. Schools locally have begun to 'double up' in the one bus (where possible) to help reduce costs also.
